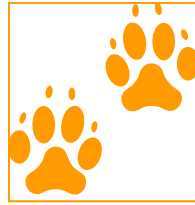
What you would need to do:

One of the rescuers will meet you at the ticket counter at American Airlines, San Juan airport. We will need a phone number to reach you while you are in Puerto Rico. You must be present to accept the dogs being signed over to you. The airlines require someone to be responsible for them while in flight. You will receive a baggage claim ticket for each dog. And that's all there is to it.



The next time you see them it will be at the Baggage Claim area at Logan Airport. A representative from the Northeast Animal Shelter will be there to meet our new arrivals.

If you feel you would enjoy helping the Satos on their journey to meet their "forever families", please don't hesitate to contact us. We will be "forever grateful".



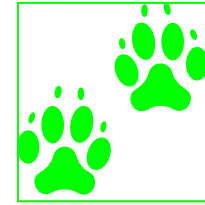
Sato Rescue Program

There are thousands of dogs wandering the streets of Puerto Rico who are abandoned, abused and neglected. These dogs are called "Sato's" or "mixed-breed street dog" in Spanish.

In 1995, a rescue group in Puerto Rico contacted the Northeast Animal Shelter and prayed that we could help their Sato's. After investigating their program and visiting their area to assess the situation, we readily agreed to help. These dogs were badly in need of special care we were able to provide at the Northeast Animal Shelter.

Since this program has been so successful, we now help other rescue groups in Puerto Rico.

When these dogs arrive at the Northeast Animal Shelter, some are eager for their next adventure, while others tend to be a bit shy—until they finally realize they have found lasting love and that they are safe.
